In this discussion we'll address all of those items and more! For instance, in a disaster, if you are being asked to evacuate—what do you do if your child is at school, your teenager is at practice and your spouse is at work? What should we talk about **BEFORE** that happens? How we communicate with our children is very important to minimize anxiety. This presentation will discuss **HOW** to communicate with your family and **WHAT** you should be communicating. Then we'll discuss fun ideas to get your whole family involved in preparing.
