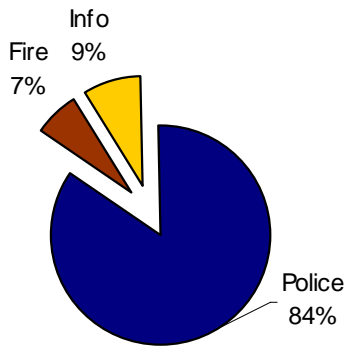

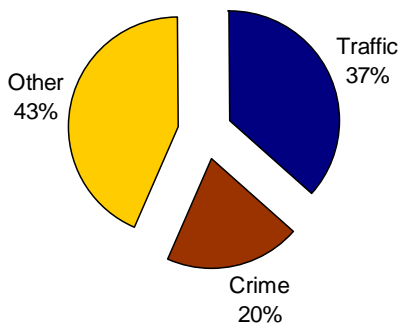
POLICE & FIRE CAD CALLS

The Communications Center created 63,947 calls in CAD (*computer-aided dispatch*) in 2007, up 11.6% from 2006. Below is the percent breakdown for police and fire responses. Information calls do not require response by police or fire.



POLICE CALL TYPES

Below, police CAD calls are categorized by how they were reported **at the time the call was taken**, i.e. a caller may report a suspicious person (classified as other call), which turns out to be a theft (crime).

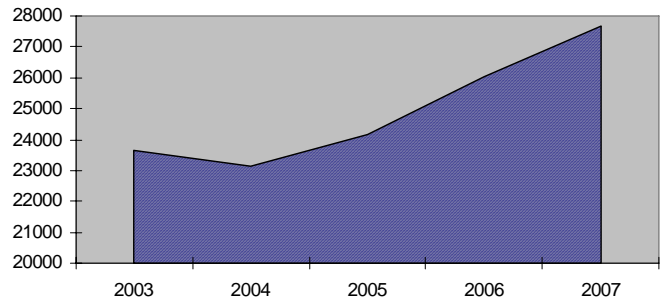


Crime Calls – Crime alleged to have occurred

NUMBER OF POLICE CASES

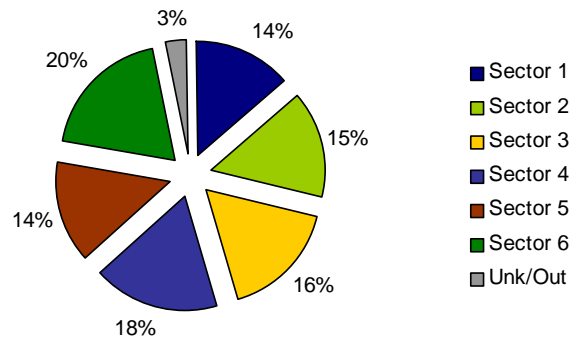
Case numbers are assigned on CAD calls when a crime has occurred, or when the reported activity warrants documentation. The number of cases increased 6.3% from 2006 to 2007.

POLICE CASES BY SECTOR

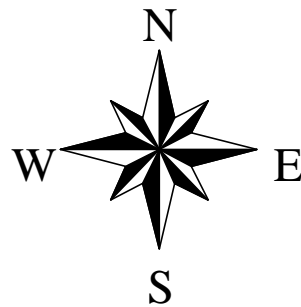
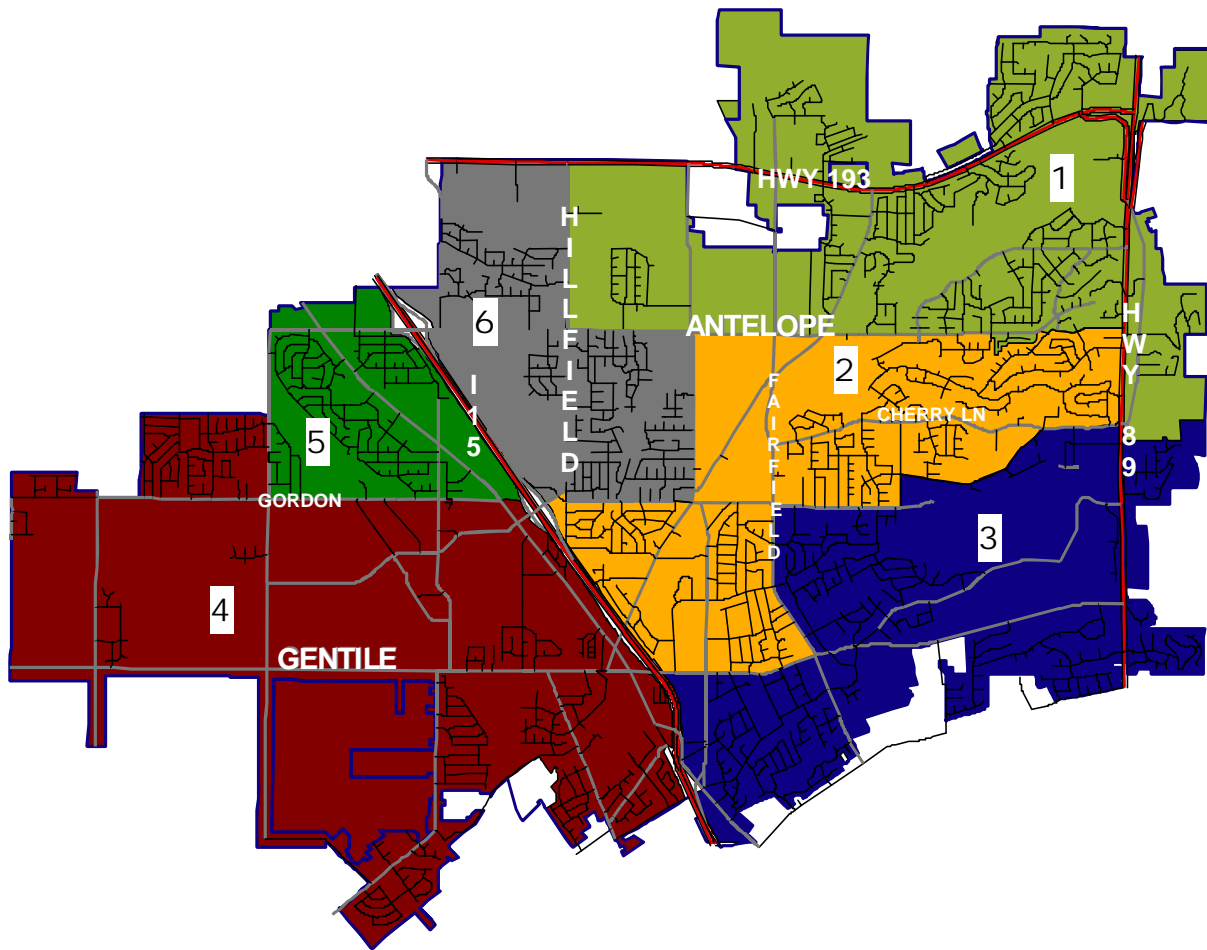
The city is divided into six police sectors. The sectors were designed to maximize police presence in relation to call load. The chart below depicts the distribution of cases per sector.



Sector 6, mostly made up of commercial area around the mall, had the highest number of cases. Sectors 1 & 5, the northeast and northwest residential areas, had the lowest.

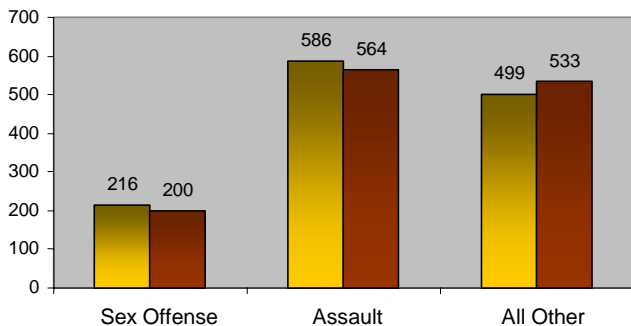

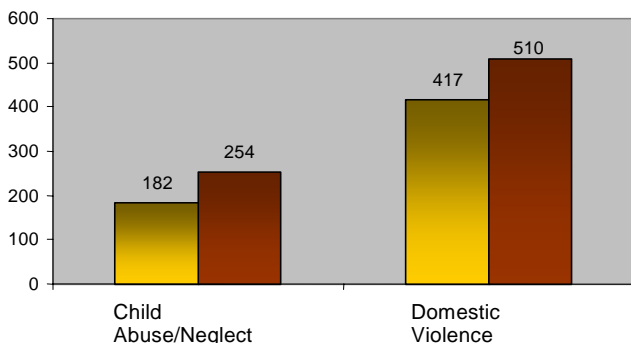
CRIMES AGAINST PERSON

Overall, crimes against person, defined as crimes in which the victim is always a person as opposed to a business and usually involves bodily injury (or threat of), remained steady from 2005 to 2006.



All other crimes against person include, homicides, threats, harassment, stalking, lewdness, & unlawful detention.

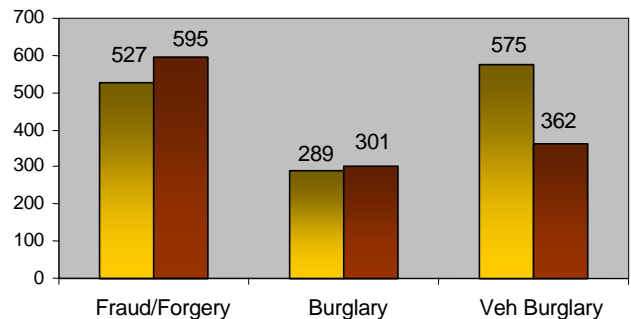
There was a significant increase in family-related crimes. Child abuse/neglect cases increased almost 40%, and domestic violence calls increased more than 20%.



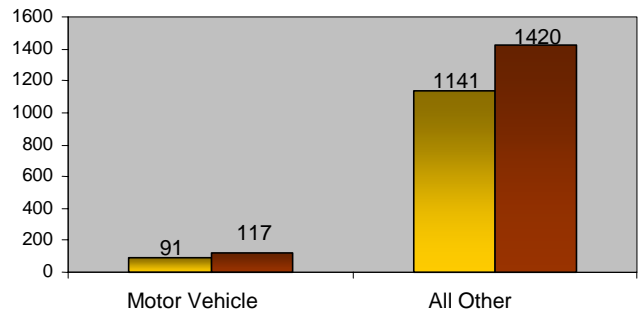
PROPERTY CRIMES

Property crimes, crimes in which the perpetrator's motive is to obtain money, property, or some other financial benefit, remained steady overall from 2006 to 2007.

Fraud/forgery cases saw moderate increases; burglaries of structures, a slight increase; and vehicle burglaries (theft of property inside a vehicle) a significant decrease.



Motor vehicle thefts and thefts classified as *all other increased significantly.



**All other thefts include shoplifting, gas thefts, bicycle thefts, and any other theft not previously defined.*

2007 Crime

INDEX CRIMES

Layton Police Department takes part in the UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING (UCR) program. The program provides a nationwide view of crime based on the submission of statistics by law enforcement agencies throughout the country. The data is submitted to the FBI and is mostly limited to the reporting of "Index Crimes."

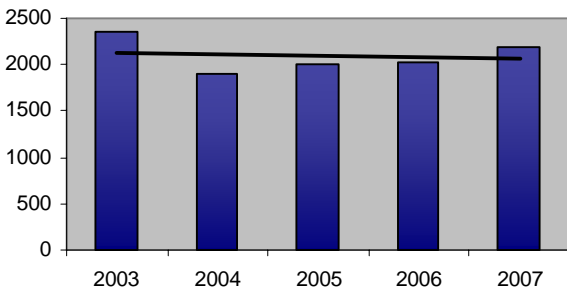
According to the FBI "index crimes" are the offenses of Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Assault, Burglary, Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson. Crimes less serious in nature, although numerous, are not represented. Also, if more than one index crime occurs in a single incident (excluding homicide, assaults, and vehicle thefts) only the most serious crime is reported.

In 2007, Layton Police Department reported the following index crimes:

- Homicide: 1
- Rape: 22
- Robbery: 14
- Aggravated Assault: 34
- Burglary: 290
- Larceny: 1,711
- Motor Vehicle Theft: 100
- Arson: 17
- Total Index Crime: 2,189

5-YEAR COMPARISON

There has been an overall decline of index crimes reported by Layton, over the past five years.



INDEX CRIMES AGENCY COMPARISON

In 2006, Layton ranked 12th highest in the state, and first in Davis County, for the total number of index crimes.

When considering population, Layton ranked 29th in the state and 2nd in Davis County.

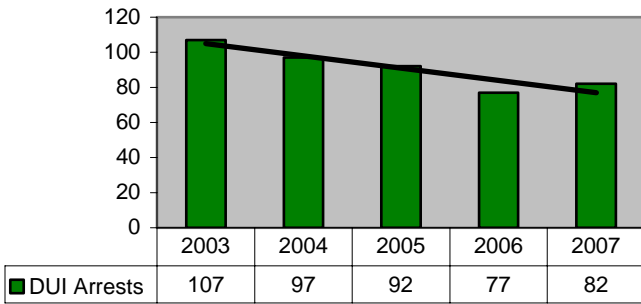

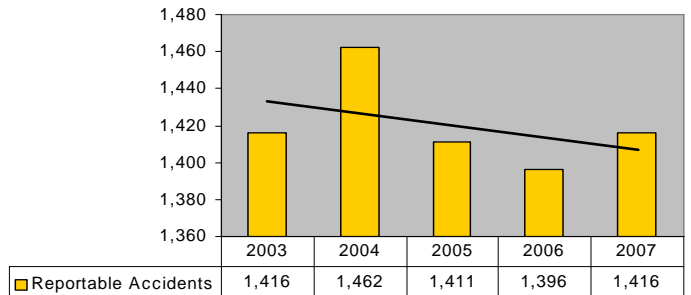
DUI ARRESTS

DUI arrests have steadily declined over the past five years.



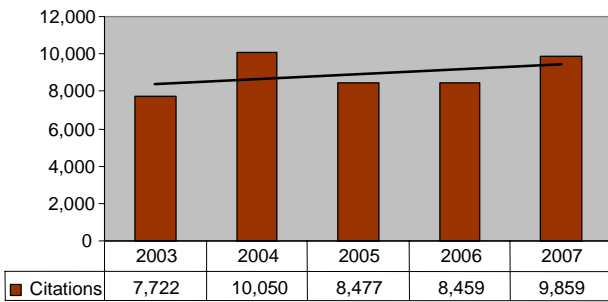
REPORTABLE ACCIDENTS

*Reportable accidents have declined over the past five years.



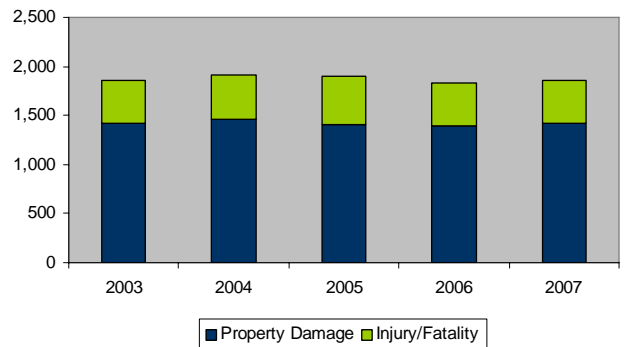
TRAFFIC CITATIONS

*Reportable accidents include injury accidents, and accidents with more than \$1,000 in damage.

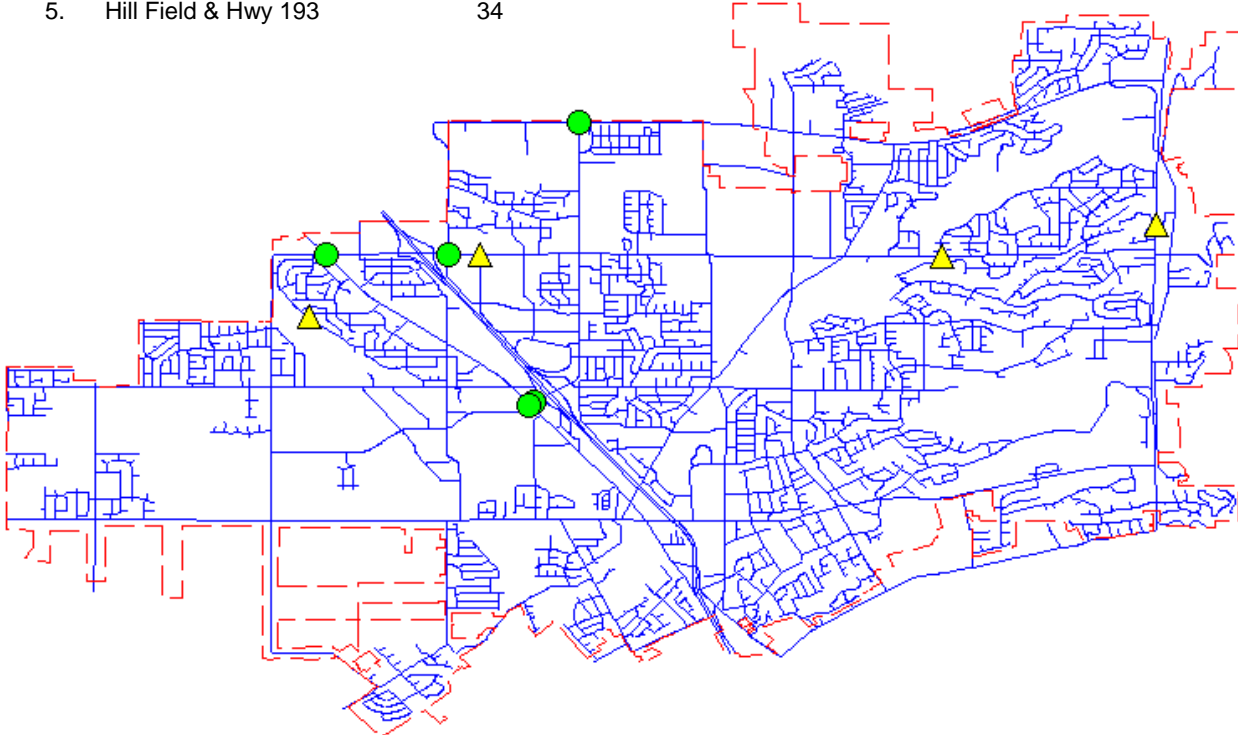
